# MISSION AND FOCUS

Circles RVA is filling an unmet need in Richmond by partnering with families on the fence between surviving and thriving through the process of goal setting, intentional relationship-building, and an expanded community of support. Circles RVA provides tools and resources to empower families to break the cycle of poverty and move towards economic stability.

We focus on encouraging people as they take steps to permanently move out of poverty. Participants, known as Circle Leaders, come from a variety of backgrounds with income levels at or below 150% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines due to either situational or generational circumstances. They **Lead** their unique path forward, drawing upon the encouragement and social capital provided by volunteer **Allies**. As an organization, we provide the social network, financial tools, and emotional encouragement that activate their economic independence.





During 2022, we implemented our goal of diverse organizational leadership. Our 14-member Board of Directors is comprised of four graduated Leaders and a broad membership of representative of our Circles RVA community. All are, or have been, involved in our operations as Leaders, Allies or volunteers. This allows us to plan and to operate with diverse perspectives. Cohorts 4 and 5 graduated and continue to move forward with their goals and aspirations. The powerful friendships and social capital they developed through Circles continues to support their growth.

We have two Co-Presidents, each serving for a two-year staggered term because we find diverse leadership to be essential. In 2022, Joel Blum succeeded Dick Ritsch as Co-President for a two-year term. Valena Dixon served her second year as Co-President. Diversity and inclusion maximizes complementary talents to build community.

# **OUR IMPACT**

#### SINCE 2018 FIVE GRADUATED COHORTS

- 36 Leaders started the program
- 33 Leaders completed the initial class
- 19 Leaders continued in the program at least 18 months
- 3 returned to school to continue their education
- 79% increased their income on average by
- \$1,154
   **76**% of them increased total assets on average by \$1,481
- On average Leaders' circles of support increased from 1 to 4

### **EIGHT LEADERS GRADUATED IN JUNE 2022 AND FOUR LEADERS GRADUATED IN OCTOBER 2022**

All 12 increased their incomes moving them closer to 200% of the Federal Poverty Level, increased their savings and credit scores, and built lasting friendships with their Allies and Circles community.

#### EIGHTEEN LEADERS ACTIVELY WORKED ON GOALS

for growth and self-sufficiency. Goals included education, career, money management, housing, and health.

#### SIX NEW LEADERS BEGAN TRAINING

In September 2022, we returned to in-person meetings and by year's end two cohorts graduated with one Cohort continuing and Cohort 7 began. They will be matched with their Allies to create their Circle and begin their 18-month journey in May 2023.

#### 12 PEOPLE BEGAN ALLY TRAINING

Allies make an intentional commitment to become both cheerleaders and accountability partners for their Circle Leader. Over time, they will expand the Leader's networks, helping them gain access to resources and leverage relationships they might not otherwise access.










# FINANCIAL REPORTING

# **MOVING INTO 2023**

Our Circles Leaders lost family members and jobs and continue to be negatively impacted by COVID. Our families were teetering between crisis and security before the pandemic and now face a road to stability that may be longer and more complex. For some, this has reduced their capacity to participate at all resulting in smaller cohorts than in the past. That said, our recruitment plan is solid, and we are reaching out to groups about the opportunities provided through the Circles experience. We are committed to ensuring that whoever is ready will have access to the social capital and emotional support that we provide so that they too can move from surviving to thriving. # PARTNERSHIPS & SUPPORT

To remain fiscally efficient and to best leverage existing resources, we operate as a volunteer-centric organization focused on engaging Richmond's strengths and goodwill. Every individual or organization that connects with Circles brings an array of valuable experience and talent to share.

#### **Resource Teams**

These behind-the-scenes volunteers share specific skills/knowledge with our Circle Leaders and support our efforts. Assistance includes resume or business plan development, legal or financial advice, connections to jobs and education information and connection with other community resources and services. Volunteers provide the social capital that everyone needs to support their success with information, or simply a contact in an agency or organization.

#### **Community Collaborations**

Our community collaborations allow us to connect Leaders with expertise that is helpful as they navigate a path forward. We offer sincere appreciation to each partner for their willingness to share their expertise with Leaders and their families during our weekly programming. Our monthly BigView night provides education and engagement around system barriers. Hospitality volunteers allow us to have fellowship and build relationships with our weekly meals.
